UPPER RESPIRATORY ILLNESS (URI)

What is a URI?

Contagious sickness caused by viruses or bacteria, infecting the respiratory system: nose, throat, lungs, airways.

Signs and symptoms:

- Cold/Flu symptoms
- Sore throat
- Cough (dry or with mucous)
- Sinus Congestion
- Runny nose
- Headache
- Fever

How is it spread/caused?

- Respiratory droplets Please wear a mask
- Contact with fluids from nasal discharge Please wash your hands frequently

Call UHS if you experience:

- fever >100 F
- chest pain
- difficulty breathing
- loss of taste and smell not related to congestion

How to manage symptoms:

- **Headache:** Acetaminophen (Tylenol), Ibuprofen (Advil/Motrin)
- Sore Throat: cough drops, throat numbing spray
- Nasal Congestion/Sinus Pressure: Sudafed (pseudoephedrine), Flonase Nasal Spray
- Runny Nose/Watery Eyes/Allergies: Zyrtec, Claritin, Allegra
- **Dry Cough:** dextromethorphan (Delsym, Robitussin), cough drops
- Mucus Cough: guaifenesin (Mucinex)
- Combination Dry/Mucus cough: Mucinex DM, Robitussin DM
